Ambassador Tommy Koh Emeritus Professor of Law, National University of Singapore; Ambassador-At-Large at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Singapore Tommy KOH is currently Emeritus Professor of Law at NUS; Ambassador-At-Large at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs; and Chairman of the International Advisory Panel of the Centre for International Law at the NUS.

He had served as Dean of the Faculty of Law of NUS, Singapore's Permanent Representative to the United Nations in New York, Ambassador to the United States of America, High Commissioner to Canada and Ambassador to Mexico. He was President of the Third UN Conference on the Law of the Sea. He was also the Chairman of the Preparatory Committee for and the Main Committee of the UN Conference on Environment and Development (Earth Summit). He was the UN Secretary General's Special Envoy to Russia, Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania. He was the founding Chairman of the National Arts Council, founding Executive Director of the Asia-Europe Foundation and former Chairman of the National Heritage Board. He was Singapore's Chief Negotiator in negotiating an agreement to establish diplomatic relations between Singapore and China. He was also Singapore's Chief Negotiator for the US-Singapore Free Trade Agreement. He acted as Singapore's Agent in two legal disputes with Malaysia. He has chaired two dispute panels for the WTO. He is the Co-Chairman of the China-Singapore Forum and the Japan-Singapore Symposium.

Professor Koh has received awards from the Governments of Singapore, Chile, Finland, France, Japan, Netherlands, Spain and the United States. Professor Koh received the Champion of the Earth Award from UNEP and the inaugural President's Award for the Environment from Singapore. He was conferred with honorary doctoral degrees in law by Yale and Monash Universities. Harvard University conferred on him the Great Negotiator Award in 2014.

**Dr. Lena Chan** Senior Director, International Biodiversity Conservation Division, National Parks Board (NParks) of Singapore Dr Lena Chan is the Senior Director of the International Biodiversity Conservation Division, National Parks Board, Singapore.

Lena's official duties include being the National Focal Point for the Convention on Biological Diversity and a Governing Board member of the ASEAN Centre for Biodiversity. She has published papers on ecology, parasitology, and book chapters on urban conservation biology. Dr Chan co-authored the Handbook on the Singapore Index on Cities' Biodiversity and co-edited a journal supplement on a comprehensive biodiversity survey of the Bukit Timah Nature Reserve.

She obtained M. Sc. from McGill University and Ph. D. from Imperial College, London.



Professor Lily KONG President and Lee Kong Chian Chair Professor Singapore Management University Professor Kong is SMU's fifth President, and the first Singaporean to lead the 23-year old university. She is also the first Singaporean woman to head a university in Singapore. She was previously Provost of SMU, and Vice Provost and Vice President at the National University of Singapore (in various portfolios). Professor Kong is internationally known for her research on urban transformations in Asia, with particular focus on social and cultural change. She has written extensively about communal relations, particularly, the intersection of religion and secularity in cities, creative industries/cities, urban heritage conservation, and smart cities. She is an award-winning researcher and teacher locally and internationally. In a global study by Stanford University (2020), Prof Kong was identified as among the world's top 1% of scientists in the field of Geography.














She was a Fellow of the Global Assessment of the Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES) and an author of IPBES-IPCC Co-sponsored Workshop Report the on Biodiversity and Climate Change.

Dr Stefanie Schacherer is Assistant Professor of Law at the Singapore Management University (SMU). Prior to joining SMU, she held positions as Postdoctoral Fellow at the Centre for International Law, National University of Singapore, and at the World Trade Institute, University of Bern, Switzerland. **Professor Nicole Graham** Associate Dean Education, Sydney Law School University of Sydney Katherine Owens is a Senior Lecturer in Environmental Law at the University of Sydney Law School, Associate Dean of Professional Law Programs, Program Director of the Juris Doctor degree and Director of the Australian Centre for Climate and Environmental Law. Her research combines both social and legal methods to address significant issues of environmental law and governance, including how law and governance should manage climate change, energy transitions, water scarcity, environmental finance and the risks of coal seam gas mining. Her monograph, Environmental Water Markets and Regulation: A Approach (Routledge/Earthscan), Comparative Legal was published in 2017. Katherine was awarded her PhD from Sydney Law School in 2015 and also holds a Master of Laws in Energy and Environmental Law Katholieke Universiteit in Leuven, Belgium (summa cum laude with the congratulations of the Board of Examiners), and a Bachelor of Laws (First Class Honours) and Bachelor of Arts from the University of Canterbury in New Zealand.

Professor Nicole Graham teaches and researches in the fields of property law and theory, and legal geography at the University of Sydney Law School. 

Sroyon is a Post-Doctoral Research Fellow at the Asia-Pacific Centre for Environmental Law (APCEL), National University of Singapore. He did his PhD at the London School of Economics (LSE), focusing on the role of courts in the valuation of natural resources and services. He has an LLM (with distinction) from LSE and a BA LLB from the National University of Juridical Sciences (NUJS), India. Dr Benoît Mayer is Associate Professor at the Faculty of Law of the Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK LAW). Professor Mayer holds degrees from the University Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne, McGill University, and the National University of Singapore. His research explores various aspects of international and comparative climate law. After a PhD thesis on the concept of climate migration, Prof. Mayer has increasingly focused on the interpretation of States' obligations on climate change mitigation arising from climate treaties, customary international law, and human rights treaties. His research has been published in periodicals such as the American Journal of International Law, the European Journal of International Law, and International and Comparative Law Quarterly, and in monographs published with Cambridge and Oxford University Press.

Rob has worked in the field of environmental law for almost fifty years, both in Australia and internationally. In his academic role, he was Dean, Law School, University of Adelaide (1995-1998) and served as the Chair of the IUCN Academy of Environmental Law (IUCNAEL) (2008-2012). He was a member of the Board of the South Australian Environment Protection Authority (2011 -2017). He has also been involved extensively in a voluntary capacity with the environmental movement in Australia, including as a Vice President of the Australian Conservation Foundation (1985-89 and 2012-15); President of Conservation SA (2010-14); and Chair of the South Australian Environmental Defender's Office (2001-2009). He also was the Convener of, and а contributor to, the Australian Panel of Experts in Environmental Law (APEEL), which produced the Blueprint for the Next Generation of Environmental Laws in Australia (2017).

Dr. YU Chen is a postdoc researcher with the National University of Singapore, Faculty of Law. Her research interests include international investment and trade law, international dispute settlement, interdisciplinary and empirical research of law, and energy regulation. Heng has advised or spoken at events organized by international and institutions (e.g., APEC, Bank organizations International Settlements, Hague Conference on Private International Law, the International Chamber of Commerce, IMF, International Centre for Settlement of Investment Disputes, United Nations Commission on International Trade Law, World Bank, and World Trade Organization), and the private sector. His current research focuses on digitalization, sustainable development, and the future of international economic relationships.
